Passing of Another Navajo Code Talker

On Friday July 29, 2022. One of the last Navajo Code Talkers from World War II passed away. Samuel Sandoval passed away quietly at the Shiprock Hospital in Shiprock, NM. Samuel was 98 years old at the time of his passing, his wife Malula was by his side. Sam had breathing problems for many years, and when he contracted

COVID for the 2nd time in early July, he never fully recovered.

Samuel joined the Marines on March 26, 1943. From the time he worked alongside Marines in Hawthorne, Nevada in November 1942, he knew he wanted to be a Marine. While working next to the Marines there, he would be asked why he had not joined the Marines yet. When he asked why he should, their answer was, "It's the toughest outfit in the world." He told his dad in January 1943 that he was joining the Marines. He signed up and went to boot camp on March 26, 1943.

When he graduated from boot camp, he went to advanced training in Oceanside, CA. That is where he met the original 29 Navajo Code Talkers. When they all sat down together, they started making the Navajo code that would be used throughout the Pacific. This code was used to send thousands of messages about Japanese movements and battlefield tactics through the rest of the war. The code was never broken. Samuel was involved in 5 battles in the Pacific.

Sam was on Okinawa when he learned the Japanese had surrendered. He had a close call on Okinawa that in later years would bring back painful memories. He was discharged from the Marines on January 26, 1946.

Upon returning to the Farmington, NM area after the service, he had many mental and emotional wounds to work through. He turned to alcohol to get him through these years. He hit bottom in 1966 when he felt a calling to help others that were having alcohol problems. So, he went back to college and received a degree in substance abuse counseling. He opened his own clinic to help others in the late 1970s. He worked there until it closed in 1992 when he retired. He joined the VFW Post 9517 in Shiprock in 2005. where he became a Life Member. He held many Post positions during his years with the Post. He would rarely talk about any of his experiences while in the military. Being a traditional Navajo, the bad things are not talked about or they will be brought back to life. Sometimes he would say things to his wife, or a close friend at the Post about something he saw or did. But it was always just in passing. He would never go in depth or dwell on any of it.

With Samuel's passing there are now only 3 Navajo Code Talkers left alive: Peter McDonald, John Kinsel Sr., and Thomas Begay. These 3 men are all that is

left of a group of men that set up, used, and expanded a code that was never broken. This code and the men behind it, helped to save many American lives and bring the end to World War II.


For those serving another year, thank you for all your hard work last year. I encourage everyone to

News from the National VFW Auxiliary Conference:

The National organizations took major hits losing almost 3 million dollars in our investments portfolio due to fluctuation of the stock market last year. At the National Conference this past July, and as your National Council representative, we discussed these losses at the meeting. Investment is a big part of the financial budget the Auxiliary relies on. When the income

fluctuates like it has for the past several years, something has got to give. Now our investment team is slowly recovering some losses. Past National President Jean Hamil saved about 1 million dollars from her budget. We are still in the black, but we need to make some changes in what is called a "deficit year"!

What is proposed as we move forward to this new year? The council has agreed under much discussion for this year to give the National Secretary/Treasurer a Cost Of Living Allowance (COLA) of only 4% even though SSA anticipates an 8% increase. Also agreed is that the last mailing of the VFW Auxiliary **printed** magazine will be the December issue 2022. The magazine will, however, still be offered digitally. This alone will save the organization \$900,000 a year. To offer it digitally will cost only \$500 per year. Those members of an Auxiliary who want it printed will need somebody to print for them at post level.

The Sr. Vice President's training budget was also reduced because Department Secretaries will no longer travel with Sr. Vice's - they will be Zoomed in. This will save on airfare and hotel costs.

The other item discussed was budget line items to the National Home repairs and renovations. This was zeroed out because this was money set aside in 2010 for emergency repairs to the homes foregoing council approval. Since COVID all houses have been upgraded and some are still vacated. If there is a need for council approval for an emergency repair the Secretary-Treasurer can Zoom the Council with technology nowadays that we did not have in 2010.

If the economy stays at this level course, we should be okay in the budget, but if the investments go way south again, National Council may have to look at other alternatives like membership dues increase. We also need to encourage Auxiliary members to use and promote the use of benefit programs such as Tru Hearing, USAA credit card, VFW Store and other programs because we get a commission from these products.



Post 9676 Final Salute to Veterans

Veterans Final Tributes/Final Salutes Ceremonies and Veteran Pinning Ceremonies

The Daniel D Fernandez Post 9676 is a VFW Post of approximately one hundred members. We are located in Los Lunas, New Mexico and are available to serve all 80,000 veterans and residents that live in Valencia County and the Villages, Towns and Municipalities therein (Los Lunas, Peralta, Bosque Farms, Belen, Rio Communities, Pueblo of Isleta, unincorporated areas and some subdivisions in south Albuquerque).

Due to the age of many of our veterans, we have performing a significant number of Veteran Final Tributes/ Final Salutes Ceremonies. In our 2021-2022 fiscal year, we honored 12 veterans and their family members at the Veterans funeral services. We also performed at least 12 Veteran Pinning ceremonies, which I may discuss in a future article. Normally at least five of our Post members volunteer to participate in an Honor Guard to perform these Final Tribute Ceremonies. The Honor Guard slowly and respectfully enters the sanctuary, under the direction of the Commander. When the Honor Guard is directly in front of the casket or urn containing the Veteran's remains, the Honor Guard comes to a halt and performs a facing movement toward the crowd. While facing the assembled crowd, the Commander offers a greeting and then explains to the funeral attendees, who we as a

group represent, and that we are there to honor a fallen comrade. He then honors the veteran with a short tribute.

The Quartermaster then continues honoring the Veteran with a second short tribute. The Chaplin then offers a short prayer. After the prayer, the Commander orders the bugler to take his post and then orders the Honor Guard to perform a facing moving toward the Veteran's remains. The Commander, Quartermaster, and usually Senior-Vice Commander then recite the following (taken from our last Final Tribute on July 25, 2022):

"Attention to Orders – For honorable and faithful Service. - Last Call for – Evan A Strickland – Lance Corporal – United States Marine Corps."

Immediately after the branch of service is read, a member of the Honor Guard rings a bell. After the bell rings for the third time, the Commander orders the Honor Guard to perform a slow final salute. The bugler then plays taps. After taps, the Honor Guard slowly complete their final salute. The Commander then asks the Honor Guard to follow him to offer condolences to the family. This is a short, but very powerful and respectful ceremony. We have received many compliments and even donations after performing these ceremonies. I recommend that all VFW Posts beginning offering fallen Veteran's families, Final Tribute/Final Salute Ceremony services.

In addition to his military career, Bert is a retired secondary school teacher in the Oregon Public School System where he taught Social Studies and coached athletics for 31 years.


