Memorial Day Ceremonies at the Vietnam Veterans Memorial in Angel Fire

Monday, May 26^{th,} the New Mexico Department of Veterans' Services (NMDVS) will honor and mourn those who paid the ultimate sacrifice in our nation's service at the Vietnam Veterans Memorial in Angel Fire, New Mexico. For the last 54 years, Memorial Day weekend has been an emotional and healing time for Veterans and their families at the Vietnam Veterans Memorial. NMDVS Deputy Secretary Eric James will be one of the speakers at the ceremony in the Memorial Amphitheater with this year's keynote speaker, Mr. Steven Trout, professor at the University of Alabama and author of "The Vietnam Veterans Memorial at Angel Fire: War, Remembrance and an American Tragedy," published in 2020.





This year's Angel Fire Memorial Day activities include the "Run For The Wall Riders" on Friday, May 16^{th,} at 3:30 p.m. The annual cross-country motorcycle ride to Washington, D.C. stops at the Memorial and the half-scale replica of the Vietnam Wall located across the road from the Chapel.

On the eve of Memorial Day, Sunday, May 25th, starting at 6:00 p.m., a remembrance vigil for Veterans who have passed will include a performance from the New Mexico National Guard's 44th Army Ensemble Band, a flag presentation by the Vietnam Vets Legacy Vets Motorcycle Club, a presentation by the Woman Veteran Warriors Color Guard, and special guest speaker Carla Dean of Gold Star Spouses of America Inc.

The Memorial Day Ceremony begins at 9:00 a.m. with the annual flag march starting at the corner of US Highway 64 and Highway 434 and concludes at the Memorial. The ceremony will feature special guests and a musical performance by the 44th Army Band Ensemble starting at 10:45 a.m. It will also feature a rifle volley by Tsidi Toii Veterans Organization, the presentation of colors by the Women Veteran Warriors Honor Guard, and a static display of a UH-60 Blackhawk Helicopter.

NMDVS manages the Memorial which now features the newly dedicated half-scale replica of the Vietnam Memorial Wall. The 123-foot-long black granite wall is engraved with the 58,318 names of every American Servicemember known to have been killed in Vietnam, including those of 400 New Mexicans.

The memorial also includes a museum, library, visitor center, memorabilia exhibit, artwork, and sculptures that provide a glimpse into the daily lives of our military history. The Memorial amphitheater, memorial walkway, and memorial gardens provide a space for reflection and remembrance. The Memorial overlooks the Angel Fire State Veterans Cemetery, which opened in July 2020. Approximately 45,000 individuals visit each year.

The Angel Fire Vietnam Veterans Memorial and Vietnam Memorial Wall are at 34 Country Club Rd. Angel Fire, NM 87710. The event is held yearly at the New Mexico Veterans Memorial Park, 1100 Louisiana SE, Albuquerque, NM 87108. The ceremony includes the presentation of colors, the national anthem, and guest speakers who pay tribute to our fallen heroes, offering us a chance to honor their sacrifice.

Before the ceremony, the Memorial Day Parade will start at 9:00 a.m. at USS Bullhead Memorial Park, 1606 San Pedro SE, Albuquerque, NM 87108. The parade will feature a procession of veterans, active-duty military personnel, and community groups. It will travel east on Gibson Boulevard from San Mateo Boulevard, culminating at Veterans Memorial Park. NMDVS encourages everyone to attend a Memorial Day/Memorial Day weekend ceremony at any of the communities listed below.

Property Tax Exemption Events

The New Mexico Department of Veterans' Services (NMDVS) is still accepting applications from Veterans for the new property tax exemptions recently signed into law on March 20, 2025.

The standard Veteran property tax exemption is now \$10,000 and will be applied to the Veteran/unmarried Spouse survivor's 2025 notice of value. In 2026 and subsequent tax years the amount shall be adjusted for inflation.

For the tax year 2026, the Disabled Veterans Exemption allows for the Veteran/unmarried surviving spouse to apply for an adjusted exemption in an amount equal to the percentage of the Veteran's disability as determined by federal law. Veterans who choose to add the new Disabled Veteran tax exemption must submit an application to NMDVS and file it with their County Assessor. These exemptions are designed to provide financial relief to all Veterans for their service and sacrifice to our state and nation.

NMDVS has scheduled Veteran property tax exemption events throughout the state to explain the changes. NMDVS will also have Veteran Service Officers (VSOs) on-site to assist Veterans and their eligible dependents with filing VA claims and obtaining federal and state benefits.

Two Albuquerque events will be held simultaneously at Bernalillo County Assessor satellite locations at Bernalillo County My Vote Centers.

NM Dept of Veterans' Services & Bernalillo County Assessor's office representatives will be on site to assist eligible veterans and unmarried widows applying for:

- * \$10,000 Standard Veterans Property Tax Exemption.
- * Percentage Based Disabled Veterans Property Tax Exemption.
- * Disabled Veterans Permanent & Total property Tax Waiver.

The following documents will be required to verify Property Tax certificate eligibility:

1. A copy of your DD-214, NA 13038, NOAA form 56-16, or PHS form 1867

* DD214 must be full form, unredacted and include character of service

* Visit www.archives.gov to request discharge paperwork if needed.

2. If applicable, VA Federal Award letter verifying service-connected disability rating

* If you do not have a copy of your current VA Award letter, a free copy can be obtained by establishing an account at www.va.gov or by calling 1-800-827-1000.

3. Proof of New Mexico Residency - Includes one of the following documents:

Valid NM Driver's license / Current voters registration card / Most recent NM income tax return

Spring Honor Guard Training Conference and Competition

On Friday, April 25th, at the Sonoma Ranch Golf Course in Las Cruces, Honor Guard teams took part in the 16th semi annual conference. Dedicated to training and performance review, the conference included an overview of the New Mexico Army National Guard (NMANG), Military Funeral Honor Team (MFHT) program, presented by the New Mexico Department of Veterans' Services (NMDVS). NMDVS manages and supports the state's 32 all-volunteer teams registered with the agency that render military honors at funerals of honorably discharged Veterans throughout the state of New Mexico.



After training, each team rendered honors at a mock funeral. A panel of judges graded their performances based on how the teams performed the flag fold, presented the flag, and, in the case of larger units, provided a rifle volley.

The judges awarded first place in the following four categories: **Small division**: American Legion Post 13 (Albuquerque) **Medium division**: American Legion Post 12 (Santa Fe) **Large division**: Marine Corps League/Detachment 478, El Pedro Diablo (Las Cruces) **Bugle competition:** Alfred Bourguet, American Legion Post 13 (Albuquerque)



NMDVS, the New Mexico National Guard, and AARP New Mexico created the *Military Honors Burial Program* to help Honor Guards comply with federal law, allowing a military funeral for anyone with a discharge other than dishonorable. Due to our state's large size, these all-volunteer honor guards are called upon to render honors at most veterans, funerals throughout New Mexico. Neither NMDVS nor the NMANG is involved with scheduling an Honor Guard. Families must work with funeral homes to arrange for a military funeral. 2025 NACVSO Leadership Summit Unites National Leaders in Veterans Advocacy

The 2025 NACVSO Leadership Summit convened in Washington, D.C. in April, bringing together state and county Veterans Service Officers from across the nation for a pivotal four-day event. This year's summit emphasized collaboration, innovation, and strategic planning to strengthen the delivery of Veterans' benefits nationwide. The gathering featured information briefings from top Department of Veterans Affairs (VA) leaders.

Veterans Administration Secretary Doug Collins addressed the summit on the future of Veterans' policy, emphasizing accountability, modernization, and outreach to underserved veteran populations. He praised the essential role of NACVSO members in bridging the gap between federal benefits and local communities. Following Secretary Collins, Under Secretary for Benefits Michael Frueh delivered an update on VBA's modernization initiatives, including advancements in claims automation, PACT Act implementation, and efforts to reduce the claims backlog.

Acting VHA Under Secretary for Health Dr. Steven Lieberman spoke about expanding access to mental health services, enhancing rural care delivery, and investing in Veteran-centric innovation. Gary Powers, Acting Principal Deputy Under Secretary for the National Cemetery Administration, reemphasized the importance of honoring Veterans with dignity in their final resting places. With renewed energy and a unified vision, NACVSO leaders left the summit inspired to continue their critical work serving Veterans and their families across the country.

New Mexico Department of Veterans' Services was represented at the summit by Robin Wilson, Division Director of Field Services, Dagmar Youngberg, Quality Control and Training Manager, and Amberly Viner, Women Veterans Program Manager. In addition to attending the VA leadership briefings, the NMDVS team met with Congressman Gabe Vasquez and key staff members from the offices of Representative Melanie Stansbury, Representative Teresa Leger Fernández, Senator Ben Ray Luján, and Senator Martin Heinrich. These vital discussions focused on current legislation impacting New Mexico Veterans and provided an opportunity to share updates on the unique challenges faced by Veterans across the state. Their presence at the summit underscored New Mexico's Department of Veterans' Services commitment to ensuring that Veterans' voices were heard.

Governor's Veteran Advisory Council Quarterly Meeting

The Governor's Veterans Advisory Council (GVAC) meeting was held April 12th in Roswell at the ENMU Campus Union Building. The GVAC council is attached to the New Mexico Department of Veterans' Services (NMDVS) and supports the needs of Veterans, reviews policies, provides recommendations, and consults with the Veteran community.

GVAC Co-Chair Rudy Martinez began the meeting by focusing on the Veterans transportation program, accessibility of medical care, and communicating the availability of benefits to younger generations. (NMDVS) Deputy Secretary Eric James shared the yearto-date report of the statewide transportation program statistics, highlighting over 931 confirmed rides and



ride request growth of over 27 percent from January to March 2025. NMDVS Cabinet Secretary Jamison Herrera said, "NMDVS is continuing to build on the growing program with more ride service providers and advertising, with a combination of federal and state funding."

NMDVS Program Directors shared updates on the statewide outreach efforts to inform Veterans about new property tax exemption increases, suicide prevention, and the expansion of state Veterans Cemeteries. The meeting concluded with a question-and-answer period for attendees and an opportunity to visit with Veteran Service Officers to check on additional benefits and services they may not be aware of.

Staff can also help with applying for state Veterans' benefits such as discounted fishing and hunting licenses, Veterans' license plates, new property tax exemptions, state park passes, and many more state Veterans' benefits.

Please bring a copy of your DD Form 214 Certificate of Release or Discharge from Active Duty, which are necessary for filing all Veterans' benefits claims. NMDVS can help Veterans file for lost or misplaced DD 214s.

News from the U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs (VA)

Scammers Target Special Monthly Compensation

Scammers frequently target veterans who receive higher compensation with Special Monthly Compensation (SMC), Purple Heart recipients, Veterans receiving income-based or survivors' pensions, and those receiving specially adapted housing (SAH) benefits. The increased financial compensation associated with SMC benefits and the visibility of Purple Heart recipients can attract those looking to exploit Veterans. These scams range from identity theft and fraudulent investment schemes to fraudulent financial services charging unnecessary fees for services VA offers for free.



The VA is committed to safeguarding Veterans, their families, and caregivers against fraudulent activity. To protect Veterans' benefits and avoid benefit payment redirection, the VA provides the following guidance.

- Do not share VA.gov usernames, passwords, or answers to security questions with anyone, including family members, accredited representatives, or anyone who receives compensation from their VA benefits.
- Do not deposit VA benefits directly into a bank account that does not have the Veteran's name on it, such as a caregiver's bank account. VA benefits should be deposited into a bank account that the beneficiary can access and where the beneficiary's name is included on the account.

Pension poaching

VA pension and survivors' pension are income-based benefits that are frequently targeted in a scam called 'Pension Poaching'. Pension poaching is a financial scam where bad actors advise Veterans to transfer assets or add unnecessary home health care expenses so they can adjust their income to qualify for VA pension or survivors' pension benefits. Obtaining VA benefits through deceptive practices may require Veterans (and not the bad actor) to repay any falsified amounts. If a Veteran needs assistance filing a claim for VA benefits or services, they should work with a VA-accredited Veterans Service Organization representative, attorney, or claims agent.

Specially Adapted Housing Grant recipients

Veterans with a service-connected disability who have been approved for Specially Adapted Housing grants should exercise caution when hiring contractors. Many scammers go door to door, so be wary of uninvited home improvement salespeople. Veterans should obtain multiple bids for any home improvement project, take time to decide on a contractor, seek references, read reviews and contact licensing agencies for verification.

If a Veteran is missing a VA benefits payment, identifies a discrepancy in payments or finds suspicious activity with their direct deposit account, they should contact VA immediately at 800-827-1000. Veterans who suspect they have experienced fraud can find resources to file a report to the appropriate agency at VSAFE.gov, by visiting https://vsafe.gov/, or calling 833-38V-SAFE.
