### **Honoring our Forgotten Heroes**

The unclaimed cremated remains of 36 Veterans were laid to rest with full military honors on Thursday, September 18th, during the 2025 Forgotten Heroes Funeral Honors Ceremony.

The morning began in Albuquerque at Legacy Church, where the Women Veteran Warriors Color Guard posted the Colors and Sgt. Rebecca Delgado of the New Mexico Army National Guard performed the National Anthem. The memorial service was led by Robert C. Noblin Jr. of Director's Choice Mortuary Services and New Mexico Department of Veterans' Services (NMDVS) Cabinet Secretary Jamison Herrera reading the Final Roll Call of the names of the Veterans. Pastor Jason Lucero of Legacy Church closed the service with prayer before the urns were escorted by law enforcement and the American Legion Riders motorcade to the Santa Fe National Cemetery (SFNC) for a memorial ceremony and interment.

Upon arrival at the cemetery, the New Mexico National Guard Funeral Honor Guard and the American Legion served as pallbearers. Attendees were welcomed by the Acting Director of SFNC, Denise Baker, before the ceremony was turned over to the master of ceremonies, Sergio Briones of SFNC. The Adjutant General of the NMNG, Major General Miguel Aguilar, delivered the eulogy, followed by Cabinet Secretary Herrera reading the Final Roll Call of names for each Veteran as Becky Christmas and Karen Alexander of Gold Star Mothers rang the Honor Bell after each name.

The Kirtland Air Force Base Honor Guard team provided a rifle volley before Chuck Atwood of Bugles Across America played taps. The ceremony concluded with a prayer by American Legion Post 95 Chaplain, Reverend Karen Street, before the interment at SFNC, assisted by the Santa Fe High School Navy JROTC cadets.







The Forgotten Heroes Funeral Program is a collaboration between NMDVS, Bernalillo County, NMNG, and the American Legion Riders, ensuring that Veterans who pass away without family or friends to claim them are buried with the dignity and respect they have earned. NMDVS would also like to thank the U.S. Marine Corps League, LCpl. ### **October is Breast Cancer Awareness Month**

October marks Breast Cancer Awareness Month, a time to recognize the importance of early detection and prevention while also honoring the strength and resilience of women Veterans.

Breast cancer is the second most common cancer among women in the United States. Women Veterans may face unique health risks due to their service, making regular screenings even more essential. Early detection through mammograms and preventive care can save lives. The Department of Veterans Affairs (VA) in 2024 also designated male breast cancer as a service-connected illness under the PACT Act.



The New Mexico Department of Veterans' Services (NMDVS) encourages all Veterans to schedule a mammogram, talk with your health care provider about preventive screenings, and connect with your local VA Women Veterans Program Manager to learn more about the benefits and services available to you.

The VA provides a wide range of health care services specifically tailored to meet the needs of women who have served. These include comprehensive primary care, specialty services, maternity care coordination, and mental health support. For breast health, VA offers mammograms, genetic counseling, and follow-up care to ensure early detection and timely treatment.

### **Available Resources for Women Veterans**

Mammograms and Screenings: Eligible women Veterans can schedule routine mammograms and breast health services through their VA provider.

Specialized Women's Health Providers: Many VA facilities have designated Women's Health Primary Care Providers trained in gender-specific care.

Whole Health Approach: VA offers wellness programs, mental health care, and peer support groups designed to support overall well-being.

### Preserving "HERstory" Living Legend Stella Lavadie



On September 17th, the New Mexico Department of Veterans' Services (NMDVS) Women Veteran Program Manager, Amberly Viner, presented World War II Veteran Corporal Stella A. Lavadie with a plaque honoring her service to New Mexico and our nation.

The ceremony took place at Stella's home in Santa Fe, New Mexico. The Military Women's Memorial also recognized Corporal Lavadie as a Living Legend, the only national honor of its kind dedicated to preserving and promoting the history of women's military service.

At 104 years old, Corporal Lavadie's service with the Women's Army Corps from 1944–1946 as a supply specialist with the 379th U.S. Army Air Force Base Unit stands as a powerful testament to resilience, sacrifice, and patriotism. She not only answered the call of duty during World War II but also paved the way for generations of women in uniform.



Her life and legacy continue to inspire, reminding us of the extraordinary contributions of women Veterans across history.

NMDVS proudly supports the Military Women's Memorial Strive For 500 Campaign, a nationwide effort honoring women who have served our country by sharing their stories and experiences.

Due to the growing demand for benefits and services, NMDVS has updated its walk-in service schedule for October.

For October, NMDVS Field Offices will continue to designate specific walk-in days for veterans seeking assistance with VA claims and State Benefits.

On these designated days, veterans can be seen without an appointment for full services.

Services remain available every weekday; however, veterans visiting field offices on non-designated walk-in days without scheduled appointments may experience limited services or long wait times but can opt to drop off applications for benefits.

NMDVS State Benefits Offices\*\* will continue to offer full service to daily walk-ins, with no change in availability.

Veterans seeking state-specific benefits may visit these offices at any time during regular business hours.

### **Upcoming DVS Veterans' Benefits Outreach Visits**

NMDVS is scheduled to make the following outreach visits at the locations listed below. Veterans and/or their eligible dependents are encouraged to stop by to file for or ask information about—VA disability ratings, VA medical or mental health care, retiree pensions, military burials, and many other VA benefits.

Staff can also help with applying for state Veterans' benefits such as discounted fishing and hunting licenses, Veterans' license plates, property tax exemptions, state park passes, and many more state Veterans' benefits.

Please bring a copy of your DD 214, NA 13038, NOAA 56-16, PHS 1867, Certificate of Release or Discharge from Active Duty, which are necessary for filing all Veterans' benefits claims. VA award letter showing percentage of disability, NM Driver's License, ID, voter Registration card, and Widow/Widower copy of marriage and death certificates if applicable. NMDVS can help Veterans file for lost or misplaced DD 214s.

### **Property Tax Exemptions**

The New Mexico Department of Veterans' Services (NMDVS) is accepting applications for the Veterans property tax exemptions signed into law on March 20, 2025. The standard Veteran property tax exemption increased to \$10,000 and will be applied to the Veteran/unmarried surviving spouse's notice of value. In 2026 and subsequent tax years, the amount shall be adjusted for inflation.

For tax year 2026, the Disabled Veterans Exemption allows for the Veteran/unmarried surviving spouse to apply for an adjusted exemption in an amount equal to the percentage of the Veteran's disability as determined by federal law. Veterans who choose to add the new Disabled Veteran tax exemption must submit an application to NMDVS and file it with their County Assessor.

### Documents needed to verify eligibility:

- A copy of DD-214, NA 13038, NOAA Form 56-16, or PHS Form 1867
- VA Award Letter showing percentage of disability
- NM Driver's License, ID, Voter registration card, or most recent NM Personal Income Tax Return
- Widow/Widower copy of marriage and death certificates

### **New Mexico State Park Lifetime Veterans Pass**

The New Mexico Department of Veterans' Services (NMDVS) is accepting applications for the New Mexico State Park Lifetime Veterans Pass. This pass gives eligible Veterans free, unlimited access to all New Mexico state parks, including day-use and overnight camping. Standard entry and campsite fees are waived, but reservation processing charges, group shelters, special event sites, and cabin rentals are not included.

The program is a partnership between NMDVS and the State Parks Division under the Energy, Minerals, and Natural Resources Department (EMNRD). To qualify, applicants must be New Mexico residents with honorable or general (under honorable conditions) service in the U.S. Armed Forces, including the National Guard, Reserves, U.S. Public Health Service, or NOAA Corps.

- A completed application form
- Proof of service DD-214, NOAA Form 56-16, or PHS Form 1867
- Proof of New Mexico residency (driver's license, voter registration, or state tax return)

Approved Veterans will receive a non-transferable vehicle hang-tag pass that must be displayed in the park.

### **United States Navy Celebrates 250 Years**

On October 13th, 1775, the Continental Congress established the United States Navy, launching a legacy of service, sacrifice, and defense that has spanned 250 years. From a small fleet of converted merchant ships during the Revolutionary War to today's highly advanced global naval force, the Navy has continually safeguarded the freedom and security of the United States.



New Mexico shares a deep and proud connection to this history.

The state is honored to have had a World War II battleship (BB-40) and a modern nuclear fast-attack submarine both bearing the name USS New Mexico, representing the state and its people on missions worldwide. Today, the USS New Mexico (SSN-779), a Virginia-class submarine commissioned in 2010, continues this tradition, operating at the forefront of undersea defense.

New Mexico's connection to the Navy extends even further. More than 95 U.S. Navy ships have been named in honor of the people, places, and history of our great state, underscoring New Mexico's enduring presence in the nation's naval heritage.

As the United States Navy celebrates its 250th birthday, the New Mexico Department of Veterans' Services honors the generations of Sailors who have served with courage, dedication, and pride. Their service reminds us that, whether on the battlefield, beneath the waves, or on the high seas, the Navy's mission and values continue to protect the freedoms we hold dear.

### Military and Veterans Day at the New Mexico State Fair

The New Mexico Department of Veterans' Services (NMDVS), in partnership with the New Mexico National Guard (NMNG), hosted Military & Veterans Day at the State Fair September 9th in Albuquerque. The event brought together Veterans, active-duty service members, National Guard, and Reserve members to connect with resources and celebrate their service.

NMDVS also debuted its new Mobile Unit. Veteran Service Officers and State Benefits staff were on hand to assist with VA benefits claims, property tax waivers, NM State Park Lifetime Veteran Passes, and other services. Tribal and Healthcare Coordination staff were also available to share information and resources with Veterans and their families.

NMDVS Deputy Cabinet Secretary Eric James emphasized the importance of remembering the sacrifices of Veterans and their families. He also took a moment to honor the service of 95-year-old Korean War Veteran, Jake Griego, who gave a moving performance of The Star Spangled Banner, along with military service songs on harmonica.

This year's keynote speaker was U.S. Army Veteran Walter Wood (Ret.), a native of Springer, New Mexico. He shared stories of his family's tradition of military service and his own journey from the quiet plains of northeastern New Mexico to a distinguished career that led him to the Pentagon, where he witnessed one of the most tragic days in American history.

### Ribbon Cutting Celebrates New Vet Center in Santa Fe

The New Mexico Department of Veterans' Services (NMDVS) attended the ribbon cutting ceremony for the brand new Santa Fe Vet Center, marking a significant step forward in serving the needs of New Mexico's Veteran and military community.

The new center is nearly twice the size of its previous home on Brothers Road. The center offers individual and group counseling, family counseling, and referrals to VA mental health care and other benefits, all without requiring enrollment in the VA healthcare system.

During the ceremony, NMDVS leadership, local officials, and community partners joined Veterans and their families to celebrate the opening of the facility. The ceremony opened with a presentation of colors by Santa Fe High School Navy Junior ROTC cadets, followed by a moving performance of the national anthem by retired New Mexico Army National Guard member Yolanda Cardenas. Retired Judge Advocate Damian Horne delivered the keynote address, attributing the help of the Vet Center in saving his life after returning home from deployment in Afghanistan. Michael Fisher, VA Chief Readjustment Counseling Officer, offered remarks as the special guest. Navy Veteran Gary Donato of American Legion Post 12 shared closing reflections, while VA Chaplain Brian Earl provided the invocation and benediction.

NMDVS conducts outreach visits every Monday and Friday at the center as part of the mission to expand outreach and ensure Veterans across the state have access to state benefits and assistance with VA claims. The new Vet Center is located at 6535 Airport Road, Santa Fe, NM 87507. Veterans are encouraged to stop by, learn more about the available programs, and connect with staff who are ready to assist them.

### 47th Annual New Mexico Conference on Aging

The 47th annual New Mexico Conference on Aging was held September 23rd–25th at the Glorieta Adventure Camps, with this year's theme, "EngAGE as You Age."

The New Mexico Department of Veterans' Services (NMDVS) Division Directors hosted a breakout session titled "Supporting Veterans and Spouses." The session provided information on state Veteran benefits, guidance on navigating VA claims, healthcare coordination, and details about women's and tribal programs offered by the agency. Veteran Service Officers and state benefits staff were also on site to assist Veterans and their families with tax exemptions, Veteran park passes, VA claims, and other inquiries.

The conference emphasized healthy aging and vibrant living; and featured educational sessions, recreational activities, and opportunities to connect with local community resources. One of the featured events was a panel discussion on staying engaged throughout life, with New Mexicans from different age groups sharing their perspectives. Among the panelists was Veteran Robert Rodriguez, Commander of American Legion Post 72, who shared his opinions and experiences representing the 60's age group. The panel's eldest participant, World War II and Korean War Veteran Raymond Bonda, who recently turned 101, shared his insights from a remarkable life journey.

NMDVS Cabinet Secretary Jamison Herrera presented Mr. Rodriguez with a challenge coin in recognition of his years of service to Veterans in New Mexico and to our nation. Mr. Bonda was honored with a special award celebrating his 101st birthday and his dedicated military service.

NMDVS extends its gratitude to New Mexico Aging Services for the opportunity to connect with older adults and Veterans across our state. We look forward to next year's conference.

# News from the U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs (VA)

### **VA Warns Veterans: Protect Yourself from Scams**

The Department of Veterans Affairs (VA) is committed to protecting Veterans and their families from fraud. Scammers continue to invent new ways to steal personal information, benefits, and money. The VA is actively monitoring fraud trends and is sharing the following information to help you stay safe.



### **Overpayment Scam**

One of the most common schemes involves callers pretending to be from the VA, claiming you owe a large debt due to 'overpayment'. Scammers use high-pressure tactics and demand immediate repayment through wire transfers, gift cards, or cryptocurrency. The VA will never demand instant repayment or ask for non-traditional payment methods.

• Official VA debt notices come only from the **VA Debt Management Center (DMC)**. Secure payment options are available at <a href="www.pay.va.gov">www.pay.va.gov</a>. If you have doubts, call **1-800-827-1000** or the **DMC at 1-800-827-0648** to verify.

### **New Scam Tactics**

Fraud schemes are constantly changing. Recently, the VA has seen increases in:

- **Bereavement scams** targeting grieving families with fake debts, inflated funeral expenses, or bogus insurance premiums
- **Mail and delivery scams** texts or emails claiming to be from shipping companies or the U.S. Postal Service demanding delivery fees

### **Natural Disaster Fraud**

In the aftermath of floods, fires, or other natural disasters, scammers prey on families already under stress. They may pose as contractors, insurance representatives, or fake charities. The VA recommends enrolling in **direct deposit** to ensure timely receipt of benefits and reduce financial vulnerability. Scammers also exploit generosity with fake charity appeals meant to divert donations away from real relief organizations. If you need resources or want to report disaster-related fraud, call **833-38V-SAFE**.

### **Protecting Your G.I. Bill Benefits**

Some non-accredited schools and programs use misleading advertising and exaggerated promises about the value of their degrees. Veterans and their families should only use G.I. Bill benefits at VA-approved institutions. Be cautious of:

- Unrealistic job placement or salary guarantees
- Pressure to enroll quickly without full details and hidden costs or vague accreditation claims

### **Stay Vigilant**

Scammers succeed when they create urgency and pressure. Protect yourself by never sharing Social Security numbers, bank accounts, or credit card details with unsolicited callers.

Your benefits are hard-earned—don't let scammers take them away. For more visit the VA here.

### **BE VIGILANT OF SCAMS**



The Federal Trade Commission estimated that in 2023 alone, Veterans, Service Members, and their families reported \$477M in losses to fraud, as per March 31, 2024 data. This number only represents the fraud that has been detected and has increased from \$413M in 2022. This is just what has

been reported. Keeping yourself safe from scams is critical when applying for benefits and services, when accessing them, or authorizing others to do so.



Companies who advertise VA benefits can only be obtained with their help. These companies may not be recognized by VA and may be attempting to charge illegal fees.



Validate: If you are interested in working with a Veteran Service Organization (VSO), agent, or attorney, use the Office of General Counsel Accreditation tool to confirm and validate their credentials. https://www.va.gov/get-help-fromaccredited-representative/ is an official source to use to verify.



Be aware of medical professionals who charge a fee or guarantee a specific benefits-related outcome. If an exam is warranted, VA will order one for you at no cost to you.

### TIPS TO AVOID VETERAN TARGETED SCAMS

Scammers are taking advantage of new opportunities to commit fraud. There's been an increase in phishing (Email), vishing (phone), and social media scams targeting Veterans, their family members, caregivers, and survivors to access their finances and benefits, or to submit claims on their behalf.

Beware of anyone who quarantees a lucrative financial benefit or service.



### DO'S

- Submit applications securely online on va.gov or other federal websites or in-person through Federal agencies offering a service. Those agencies will assist in gathering evidence necessary to support it. There are no costs or hidden fees to apply.
- Be cautious of:
- Aggressive companies who may try to pressure you to sign their contract through frequent communications or by insisting "you must act now or lose your chance for benefits."
- Companies who claim to be contacting you on behalf of VA or to have a special relationship with VA. Contact VA at 1-833-38V-SAFE if you are unsure about the authenticity of any message received.
- Use two-factor identification, like login.gov, when available.

### **DON'TS**

- Do not sign a contract agreeing to pay an unauthorized company a percentage of your benefit payment in exchange for their assistance with your VA claim. If you need help filing a claim, there are representatives of VSOs, agents, and attorneys who have been accredited by VA to assist you.
- Do not sign a blank form for someone else to complete later.
   Always review the completed form before signing and keep a copy for yourself.
- Do not be fooled by companies who advertise they have special relationships with medical professionals and can guarantee you a specific claim outcome. If they are defrauding the Federal government, you could be held responsible for paying those benefits back.
- Do not provide identifying information like your social security number, medical records, or other personally identifiable information to anyone offering claims assistance before confirming their credentials using the Office of General Counsel Accreditation tool.





- Is free from communicable illness (flu, chicken pox, measles, C-Diff, COVID, etc.)
- . Agrees to the Fisher House Guest Agreement and Rules




