# **Veterans Day Around New Mexico**

Veterans Day Weekend 2024 was busy around New Mexico. Many Posts and their Auxiliaries held activities to celebrate the day. There were parades, flag presentations, open houses, and ceremonies of all types. We sure got out there and showed the public what the VFW/VFWA stands for.

On Saturday, November 9 VFW Post 614 in Aztec started the day with a breakfast for veterans and had over 20 people come out. Followed by their annual parade, where they had 21 entries of floats, walkers, and dignitaries. After the parade, the Post held an open house where they had over 70 people from the community attend to thank veterans and talk to with them. A band ended the night with live music.

Farther north and east, Post 1131 in Mora had their veterans dance and dinner night. The Post and Auxiliary hosts this event annually, and this year they had over 50 people attend.

Down in the southeast part of the state, Post 3274 in Hobbs had their annual parade. This year they had over 40 participants, to include State Commander Brian Ravak and his wife, Shelly. While Past State Commander and Past Post Quartermaster Cathy Brock was the Grand Marshal of the parade. State Commander Ravak and Post Commander Eubank rode in the Corvette behind the Grand Marshal. Commander Ravak was given the special treat when ordered by the owner of the 'Vette "to take it for a spin." When the parade was over, 200 people came back to the Post for the ceremony where Post Commander Eubank and Post Quartermaster Bowman introduced their new scout pack. Four awards were given out for continued service to the community. They were given to Eddie Rodriguez, Cathy Brock, Ross Clanton, and Frank Saragoza.

Also down south, Post 6917 held their parade. They had many entries.



#### **Espanola Veterans Parks**

Back up in Albuquerque, Post 401 held their annual turkey bingo event. They had over 40 people attend and handed out over 10 turkeys.

On Sunday, November 10, the activities continued. Post 3274 down in Hobbs had a recruiting event at CORE (Center of Recreational Excellence), where they talked to veterans, and in particular some pickleball players, about the VFW. Membership applications and Buddy Poppies were handed out.

# **VFW National Council Updates**



#### Comrades.

My first National Council of Administration (NCOA) new member training and meeting was held in Kansas City, MO, from September 3rd to 7th, 2024. The National Council serves as your executive board within the Veterans of Foreign Wars, where we discuss key budget and policy matters.

#### Investments

VFW's conservative investment strategy is yielding positive results. We maintain a modest and cautious approach to ensure

our cash reserves and funding for critical programssuch as lifetime pensions and memberships-remain secure. We will continue to follow this disciplined strategy to support these vital initiatives.

#### 2024-2025 Budget

The proposed budget, which is straightforward and highlights efforts to fund Service Officers (at the state level), major programs, and recruitment activities across the organization.

#### Staffing

We are fortunate to have a dedicated staff at both the National Headquarters in Kansas City, MO, and in Washington, D.C. However, we must carefully manage resources. Over the next year, we will reduce five positions, lowering financial liabilities.

At present, our median salaries in Kansas City and D.C. are approximately \$3,000 and \$10,000 below market averages, respectively. To remain competitive and retain qualified employees, the NCOA approved a 3.6% increase in the salary scale for all employees, adding \$11,000 in overall salary expenses this year. I supported this measure. Note: The salary increase does not apply to the Commander-in-Chief, Senior Vice Commander-in-Chief, or Junior Vice Commander-in-Chief, who have been under a salary freeze for several years.

#### Washington Memorial Building

Our D.C. office, built in the 1950s, is in dire need of repair. A long-term proposal was presented to upgrade the building at an estimated cost of \$8 million over several years, though voting has been delayed pending further information. However, urgent electrical and mechanical system repairs totaling \$1.6 million were approved, and I supported this decision.

#### VFW Riders and Motorcycle Clubs

The National Council voted unanimously to revoke the use of the VFW name, trademarks, and service marks by the "California VFW Motorcycle Club" due to repeated violations of prior resolutions. Additionally, as part of the same motion we voted to disallow the future use of the VFW name, service marks, etc to any entity identifying as an "MC" or "Motorcycle Club."

However, we will formalize the VFW Riders group (active I'm pleased to report that the in nearly 40 states) within our organization. A proposed bylaw amendment to establish a National VFW Riders group will be introduced at the 2025 National Convention in Columbus, OH. This will be in a similar fashion to the VFW Auxiliary and the Military Order of the Cooties.

#### Voice of Democracy Program

There was considerable discussion regarding the liabilities and financial obligations of the Voice of Democracy program. A vote on changes will be held at the NCOA meeting in Washington, D.C. in March 2025, after more information is gathered.

Notably, over 75% of participants have previously visited D.C., and ongoing issues with "helicopter parents" have become untenable. Moving the trip to Valley Forge not only reduces liability but also saves the organization over \$100,000 annually. Key points:

- National will continue to cover State Commanders' costs to attend the D.C. conference.
- National will now cover the full cost for students to attend Valley Forge, which was previously covered by the Departments.

That concludes my report on the NCOA meeting. I look forward to providing further updates and hearing your feedback as we continue our work throughout the years.

The next meeting is in March at the Washington conference. Please let me know how you want me to vote for the parade of winners or to address other important stuff. Thank you!



# **Veterans Day Around New Mexico continued**

On Monday, November 11, the activities kicked into high gear across the state again.

Down south in Hobbs, Post 3274 Quartermaster Mark Bowman spoke at the City of Hobbs Veterans Day Ceremony. More pavers were dedicated along the patch of freedom, like is tradition there every Memorial Day and Veterans Day. After this, QM Bowman read the eulogy of Col DR Bales, who was the last person to fly F-105 tail number 110 on display at Hobbs Veterans Memorial Park, who passed away earlier this year. After this, State Chaplain Bowman went to three nursing homes in Hobbs and Lovington to talk to veterans and check on them. Back to the east part of the state in Clovis, Post 3280 had their parade and open house. They had more entries this year than in past years. At their open house, they presented awards for the parade to American Legion Riders and Cannon AFB.

Up north Post 5610 in Espanola, a joint ceremony with Espanola Valley High School ARJROTC ceremony took place at the Memorial Wall. The ceremony included a POW table ceremony, where the meaning of the table and items on it were explained. There was also a colors presentation and a Declaration of Veterans Day by the City of Espanola. There were over 65 people present for these ceremonies.

In the northwest, VFW Post 9517 from Shiprock, started the day at Memory Gardens cemetery in Farmington with a rededication of the veterans memorial. This was attended by over 25 people. The Kirtland Central ROTC, Blue Star Mothers, and DAR were there to help with the ceremony. The cemetery then had a meet and greet with the veterans present and a cookout. Post 9517 Honor Guard went to 3 Rivers Estates for a Flag Presentation at the assisted living center. There were over 50 people present for this, wth over 25 veterans living in the center. VFW 9517 stayed and talked to the veterans and planned a visit from the State VSO to come up and help them start their disability claims and explain the new laws that were voted in this year.

As you can see, the VFW and VFWA were active and in the community during this special holiday. We do this all the time. We just need to promote these events. Let others in the community see them. Let the community hear and see the VFW and VFWA. We are a strong advocate for veterans and their families. We need to let people see our strength and dedication. I know there were other activities out there. More Posts and Auxiliaries were active. But we need to get the word out.


